MYCOPLASMA BOVIS







Minimising the risks at shows and events

Mycoplasma bovis is a bacterial disease that only affects cattle. The main way Mycoplasma bovis spreads is through close and prolonged contact between cattle; and calves drinking milk from infected cows.

The risk of Mycoplasma bovis spreading at A&P shows, calf days, rodeo and other events where cattle are present is quite low, but there is still a risk wherever cattle may mingle.

Event organisers need to take these risks into account and manage mitigations when deciding if to hold their event while Mycoplasma bovis is being eradicated in New Zealand.

Animals on known infected farms are under movement control, and cannot be moved without MPI's permission. However, through efforts to eradicate this disease we are still tracing movements of animals, and we expect there are some we haven't reached and tested. So, it's important you take extra precautions to reduce your chances of spreading Mycoplasma bovis.

What can exhibitors do?

- · Animals on properties under any suspicion of exposure to Mycoplasma bovis should not be transported to shows and events.
- Animals showing clinical signs of ANY disease should not be transported to shows, as per normal biosecurity practice.
- · Make sure your cattle are tagged and registered with
- Keep your NAIT movements up-to-date and accurate and record movements to and from the event. Guidance is available on nait.co.nz
- · Practice good on-farm biosecurity and clean and disinfect outerwear, boots and equipment before attending a show or event. On your return, clean and disinfect again before taking outerwear, boots and equipment back onto your farm. For more information refer to the guidance on mpi.govt.nz/bovis

What can show and event organisers do?

- · Ensure that exhibitors and participants are aware of your biosecurity and hygiene recommendations and their NAIT obligations.
- Animals without a NAIT tag should be denied entry and non-compliance reported to MPI.
- Ensure stalls are cleaned out before you put cattle in them, and after cattle are removed. Where possible, don't use the same stalls for cattle belonging to different exhibitors.
- Provide hand sanitiser for anyone likely to be handling the heads of animals from different owners.
- · Any milking equipment used at the show should be cleaned and disinfected between uses on animals from different exhibitors.
- Give animals individual water do not allow animals to drink from shared troughs.
- Best practice is to separate animals of the same species where possible, to prevent the spread of any disease. This can be by separating animals with walkways, using empty pens, and using outriggers or double barriers where animals are in adjacent pens.
- · Don't keep animals in show pens for long, to reduce stress and nose-to-nose contact.
- · Keep animals from different herds separate and avoid their nose-to-nose contact.
- Ensure pens are secure, and that when animals are out they are tethered or being securely managed by somebody who is strong and skilled enough (this could mean supervising children with calves).
- At rodeos when cattle are using the chute, disinfect all surfaces between each use with approved agricultural disinfectant, mixed as per manufacturer instructions.

ATTENTION ALL EXHIBITORS:

At the Show, unlike in a paddock, animal movement is restricted, and the animals can't go and find their own shade/water. As the Show is held in summer, it is recommended that you bring shade and suitable water containers for your animals.

DISEASE CONTROL

PLEASE READ THE MPI / BIOSECURITY INFORMATION IN THIS SCHEDULE.

Tuberculosis Testing

- ALL LIVESTOCK: Must Have a TB Animal Status Declaration Card (including calf club animals). A
 copy of the Declaration must accompany entry forms and the ORIGINAL must be brought with you to
 the Show as they will be inspected in the unloading area. This is a legal requirement for all animals
 being moved.
- 2. All cattle entered for showing must be accompanied in transit by a signed and dated TB Animal Status Declaration Card, showing a TB Clear Status in accordance with present legislation.
- 3. All exhibitors must sign the declaration on the official entry form.
- 4. Animals being moved to a show MUST HAVE the Official NAIT location identity number included on entry forms and the animals MUST HAVE the WHITE, NAIT approved RFID ear tag Identification.
- 5. **NORTHLAND LIVESTOCK:** For animals from Northland [C10 status herds in Surveillance Areas] NO test is required but a clearly dated test allocation form or other documentation from the Animal Health Board must be submitted that shows the herd is not overdue for a whole herd test.
- 6. ALL AREAS OTHER THAN NORTHLAND: For animals from all other herds and areas -
 - If the herd has a C3 status or better, no test is required PROVIDED the last whole herd test was within 12 months prior to the show.
 - If the last whole herd test was not within 12 months of the show, then show cattle over one year old MUST have a clear test within 60 DAYS of the show.
 - If the herd has a status of C1 or C2, then show cattle over one year old MUST have a clear test within 60 DAYS of the show.
 - This certificate showing individual animal identification numbers and current status MUST accompany completed entry forms or the entry will not be able to be accepted by the Secretary.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR EXHIBITORS & COMPETITORS

Whangarei A & P Society will conduct this Show in accordance with the Rules and Regulations for the governance and conduct of A & P Shows, as ratified by the RAS of NZ, which rules will be on display at the Show Office.

Please note we allow all dairy cattle that are ID recorded with LIC or Ambreed, to enter any relevant dairy class.

HEALTH & SAFETY INFORMATION

All Exhibitors agree to comply with the Terms of the Health & Safety at Work Act 2015 and its subsequent amendments. Whangarei A&P Society will accept no responsibility in any claim from any person resulting from non-compliance with the Act. All Exhibitors and Competitors must follow the instructions of Stewards and Officials. Exhibitors and Competitors are responsible for ensuring animals are kept in control at all times. Whangarei A&P Society reserves the right to order immediate removal from the Showgrounds of any animal it considers dangerous, unruly or unmanageable. Exhibitors and competitors must ensure that they keep walkways and access ways clear and no dangerous equipment or chemicals are accessible to the public. NO SMOKING is permitted in any toilets, showers, marquee, gazebo or tent. Whangarei A&P Society reserves the right to impose a fine of \$500.00 on any person found smoking in these areas.

First Aid

First aid is available on the upper level. Contact the Show Office. Accidents must be reported to your Chief Steward and the Show Office.

Legal Liability – The Society's policy does not cover Competitors and Exhibitors

Each exhibitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazard created, or accident, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves or their animals at the Showgrounds. Exhibitors must comply with the appropriate Animal Legislation and the Health & Safety at Work Act 2015. No person is permitted in any judging ring without express permission from the Head steward of that ring. Only persons directly responsible for an Exhibit are permitted in the marshalling area.

ALL EXHIBITORS are required to maintain good control over their animals and the area in which their animals are stalled and to keep equipment in tidy order at all times so as not to interfere with access through the passageways.

All exhibits shall be at the sole risk of the owner or exhibitor and Whangarei A&P Society shall not, under any circumstances, be responsible for loss or damage, mis-delivery, detention or delay of exhibits of any description whatsoever.

COMPLETION OF ENTRY FORMS

Entries & Online Entries

Enter Online at <u>showdayonline.com</u>. Online entries are simple and easy to do. We accept online or email entries only. Please note online entries are paid at the time of entry. The online entry system allows you to safely pay directly. Note: Youth Section entries are free.

No entries will be acknowledged unless accompanied by entry fees. Entries will not be processed unless ALL monies are enclosed and the entry form is properly completed. No telephone entries will be accepted. The onus of responsibility for the accuracy of all entries lies solely with the exhibitor, who must ensure that each entry is legible and that all details required for any class are fully and correctly stated on the entry form. Several events are run concurrently. Competitors should select which class they favour as there will be no refund of entry fees where classes overlap.

Membership Discount

This only applies if the entrant is a current, financial member of the Whangarei A&P Society as at 30 September of the year of the Show. (WAP Members.)

Refund of Entry Fees

Exhibitors desiring refund of entry fees must apply in writing enclosing a veterinarian's or doctor's certificate. Such application will be considered by the Committee, and if successful, refunds will be made less 25%.

Late Entries WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. Entries Close 5pm on 17th November.

Receipt of Entries

COMPETITORS are responsible for checking their entry receipt/confirmation carefully. A receipt showing all details of your entries will be returned to you following data processing. Please note any overpaid entry fees will only be refunded upon request and if the overpayment is \$5.00 or more. Entry forms will NOT be returned to you. Any alterations to classes must be made to the Show Secretary by 24 November in writing (by email). NO EXCEPTIONS other than Novice upgrading changes.

Refund of Entry Fees

Exhibitors desiring a refund of entry fees must apply in writing enclosing a veterinarian's or doctor's certificate. Such an application will be considered by the Committee, and if successful, refunds will be made less 25%.

Arrears

Any person who is in arrears regarding entry fees, subscriptions, or any other show/event charge is ineligible to compete at any affiliated show/event. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction is lifted.

COVID 19

If the Show is unable to proceed due to restrictions relating to COVID 19 entry fees will be refunded less an administration fee.

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Electronic or Audio Equipment

Electronic or Audio Equipment carried on a competitor deemed to be possible of outside assistance to a competitor is banned from all competitions at any RAS or affiliated shows, with the penalty of forfeiting all prize money, awards and qualifications and elimination from any further classes at that show.

Gate Admission Passes

One gate admission is provided per competitor as named on the entry form.

Catalogue/Substitutions

When an animal has been duly entered and catalogued in any class, the substitution of another animal will not be permitted.

Ground Levy

Where applicable, a ground levy of \$7.00 per animal, to a maximum of \$20.00, must be included with entry forms.

Class Amalgamation

The Society reserves the right to amalgamate classes if there are insufficient entries or split classes if they are too large.

Prize Money

In all classes throughout the schedule, the full prize money will be paid out if there are four or more entries. If there are three entries or less, prize money will be scaled.

For example, where the Prize Money is 1st = \$30, 2nd = \$15, 3rd = \$10:

1 entry 1st \$10

2 entries 1st, 2nd \$10, \$10

3 entries 1st, 2nd, 3rd \$10, \$10, \$10

4 entries 1st, 2nd, 3rd \$30, \$15, \$10

Sponsored prize money of a section or class may be paid in lieu of Society prize money and will not be additional. Sponsorships are subject to confirmation.

Prizewinners

Ribbons and prizemoney will be presented on conclusion of events. Whangarei A&P Society no longer allows cups and trophies to leave the Showgrounds. Cups and trophies are available for viewing in the trophy cabinet inside the foyer at the Barge Showgrounds Events Centre.

Publication of Show Results & Photos

The Whangarei Agricultural & Pastoral Society reserves the right to publish show results. Entry in the show entitles the Society to publish an exhibitor's name in result reports and distribute with exhibitor lists. Furthermore, as an entrant in the Show, any photographs taken of entries, competitors or exhibitors may be used for publicity purposes by the Society.

Alteration to Programme and Prize Money

The Whangarei A & P Society reserves the right to alter the programme and prizemoney without prior notice.

Dogs and/or other animals

It is the preference of the Whangarei A&P Society that no animal except those entered in the Catalogue, or as part of a Trade Display or Entertainment, is brought to the Showgrounds during the Show. IF a dog is brought onto the grounds, it must be on a lead at all times OR fully contained and controlled within a vehicle or horse float. In NO circumstances is a dog to be walking or running free on the Showgrounds during the Show. This includes after hours.

FORMALITIES & PROTOCOLS

Rights of Whangarei A&P Society & Committee

The Society reserves the right to refuse or cancel any entry without adducing any reason for so doing and reserves the right to make any alteration to the Show timetable, or withdraw any event as may be deemed desirable.

All persons admitted into any premise controlled by the Society are subject to the orders of the Society's committee and officials. Should any such person, in the opinion of the Society, its committee or officials, infringe any of these Conditions and Regulations or refuse to comply with the directions of the same, or be guilty of any fraudulent or unfair practice or any deceit or concealment either in entering or exhibiting or competing, shall be disqualified. Furthermore, their name shall not appear in the official prize list, and the Society shall have power to suspend such person from exhibiting or competing during such period as it may think fit. The decision of Whangarei A&P Society and its committee shall be absolutely final in all cases.

Sportsmanship

The purpose of our show is to provide our community and visiting competitors with the opportunity to have an enjoyable day of fun and friendly competition. Therefore any person or persons who verbally or otherwise abuses fellow competitors, stewards, judges, show officials or animals may be asked at the discretion of the Show, to leave the Showground.

Discipline

Bad behaviour will not be tolerated. The CEO, President, or any two members of Whangarei A&P Society Executive Committee may eject from the Showground, without compensation or return of fees, any person whose conduct or behaviour, either personal or as proprietor of a side show or exhibit, is a source of annoyance. This includes any exhibitor, competitor or member of the public who behaves in a manner, which in the opinion of the Judges or Society representatives, is considered to be rude, bad manners, disobedient or abusive or which is designed to be or has the effect of harassing or being discourteous to any Steward, Judge, or other Show Official, animal or exhibit.

Penalty

Penalty for such offence may include expulsion from the Show, disqualification, suspension from exhibiting during such period as it may think fit.

Issues, Disputes, Protests, Yellow and Red Cards

The principle behind this process is to deal with the matter as it comes to hand and in most cases, it should be dealt with directly by the show, as per the RAS In-Line Resolution Process Policy. If the matter is in regard to an RAS official, then it is forwarded on to the RAS CEO to handle in an appropriate manner. These rules apply to Calf Club and Pet Lamb & Goat Classes:


- 1. The Society reserves the right to amalgamate classes or combine age groups depending on the number of entries in a class. The Chief Steward has the discretion to alter the age range in order to balance rings based on entry numbers.
- 2. If any query arises during the day, it will be referred by the Steward to the Judge. The Judge's decision will be final.
- 3. Competitors must care for and feed the animals themselves as soon as possible after birth.
- 4. Only one animal may be entered by each competitor.
- 5. If the owner is indisposed a substitute handler may show the animal, but if a ribbon is won, it is to go to the owner.
- 6. When selecting the Champion and Reserve, the 1st placegetter or any competitor with two 2nd places in leading and rearing will be eligible.
- 7. The course for leading will be a figure 8 shape.
- 8. The animal will be on the right hand side of the competitor.

Calves - Conditions of Entry

- 1. Competitions are open to heifer, steer or bull calves, of any breed.
- 2. Calves must be born between 1st July and 30th September.
- 3. There shall be adopted a uniform system for calf judging and all Judges will conform to standards as set down by the Chief Steward.
- 4. Calf leads to be approximately 1½ metres long.
- 5. For the purpose of judging type, calves are divided into three groups:
 - a. Light breeds (Jersey & Ayrshire)
 - b. Heavy breeds (Shorthorn & Holstein Friesian)
 - c. Beef breeds

Lambs/Goats - Conditions of Entry

- 1. Lambs & Goats must be born after 1st July.
- 2. Lambs may be brushed.
- 3. SPOT washing of lambs/goats may be permitted but not to the extent that the natural oil is washed from the fleece.
- 4. The Chief Steward has the discretion to alter the age range in order to balance rings based on entry numbers.

Rules:

- 1. Judged on leading, presentation, courtesy, dress, showmanship and relationship between exhibitor and animal
- 2. Points will be awarded out of 10 for each class entered
- 3. Only one entry per exhibitor
- 4. Exhibitor does not have to own the animal
- 5. Animals entered in this class may be shown and presented as they come, direct from the paddock, or groomed and clipped the choice is yours. The judge's focus is the exhibitor and their relationship with the animal, rather than the animal/conformation.
- 6. Three age groups will apply from 13 to 25 years, but they will all compete together in the ring (unless numbers dictate otherwise, in which case the steward will separate exhibitors into smaller groups). (Age groups subject to stewards discretion on the day but likely 13-16; 17-20, 21-25.) Age of exhibitor is at December 1 of the current year
- 7. If numbers warrant, ribbons will be presented for 1st, 2nd and 3rd placings in each age bracket.
- 8. Sheep Exhibitors may also want to enter the Lifestyle Sheep classes see the Sheep section of this schedule.

RULES FOR DAIRY CATTLE:

Please see the conditions of Entry at the front of this Schedule and as follows.

Please also ensure that you have read the MPI / Biosecurity information in this schedule.

Open Calf Classes are only open to exhibitors who have not entered calf club. Any calves entered must have been born, reared and still reside on the exhibitors property at the time of the Show.

All animals must have eartags. Show arrival times will be set and staggered to allow exhibitors to use the wash down facilities with no other cattle present. This will also allow for proper disinfecting between exhibitors. Once entries have closed exhibitors will be advised of their show arrival time.

As the Show is held in summer, it is recommended that you bring shade and suitable water containers for your animals.

- 1. Dairy classes are open to all breeds, pedigree or unregistered animals that are ID recorded (with LIC or CRV)
- 2. All animals to have a Condition Score of not less than 4.5 to be allowed entry into the ring.
- 3. All cattle must tie up and be led for judging. Cattle may only be tied up with animals from the same property.
- 4. Exhibitors leading or parading stock in judging rings must wear clean, white attire (shirt) or a breed uniform and these may not carry any distinguishing words or emblems.
- 5. No animal will be allowed to compete in more than one class, except in Special Classes, and in Special Classes no animal may compete without being entered in ordinary class for which it is eligible.
- 6. All cattle entries in-milk classes must be accompanied by production figures for the last period, on entry form.
- 7. All cattle (except unregistered calves) must be named on entry form no exceptions.
- 8. If any injection or dosing is given to any animal the exhibitor must report this to a Chief Steward of the section.
- 9. Any alteration of conformation of cattle as per RAS rules will be considered malpractice and disqualified from the show.
- 10. All led cattle must carry number corresponding with entry number.
- 11. These numbers will be issued on morning of Show.
- 12. It will be an instruction to the judge that no awards be made unless exhibit is true to type.
